RECOMMENDATION EXAMPLE:

- ✓ **Incomplete: The County should implement a three percent excise tax on commercial cannabis.**

This recommendation does not explain the policy objective attempting to be achieved by the three percent excise tax and provides no flexibility.

- ✓ **Better: County taxes on commercial cannabis should be sufficiently low to incentivize a speedy transition from an unlicensed market to a regulated market.**

This recommendation is clear, flexible (as to the amount of the tax), and relates to one of the objectives.
